Now faith, hope, and love remain—these three things—and the greatest of these is love.

Celebrating Love in All Its Forms As Valentine's Day approaches, our thoughts often turn to romantic gestures, heartfelt cards, and expressions of affection. While the holiday is commonly associated with romantic love, the Bible teaches us that love is far more multifaceted and profound. In 1 Corinthians 13:13, we are reminded, "Now faith, hope, and love remain—these three things—and the greatest of these is love." Let's explore the four distinct biblical expressions of love and consider how each can enrich our relationships and communities during this season.

Eros: Romantic/Passionate Love

Eros is the passionate love that exists within romantic relationships, especially between a husband and wife. While the term itself is not directly mentioned in the New Testament, its spirit is present in the biblical vision for marriage—a deep, devoted, and joyful partnership. This Valentine's Day, celebrate eros by nurturing your marriage or romantic relationship with intentionality and affection.

Philia/Phileo: Brotherly/Friendship Love

Philia, or friendship love, represents deep bonds of affection and camaraderie. The friendship between David and Jonathan is a beautiful biblical example of philia—a love that is rooted in mutual respect, loyalty, and equality. This Valentine's Day, cherish the friends who walk beside you, celebrate with you, and support you through life's ups and downs.

Storge: Familial/Natural Love Stories the natural affection shared between family members, such as parents and children or siblings. It is marked by a deep emotional connection, familiarity, and enduring support. Valentine's Day offers an opportunity to reflect on the importance of family, express gratitude, and strengthen these foundational relationships.

Agape: Unconditional/Sacrificial Love A gape is the highest form of love, embodying God's unconditional, selfless, and sacrificial love for humanity (John 3:16). Unlike fleeting emotions, agape is a deliberate choice—an action-oriented commitment to the well-being of others. This Valentine's Day, we can aspire to show agape by offering kindness, forgiveness, and generosity, even when it is difficult.

Whether you are single, married, part of a close-knit family, or surrounded by cherished friends, Valentine's Day is a time to honor every dimension of love. By embracing agape, philia, storge, and eros, we can reflect God's love more fully in our lives and share His light with those around us.

FINANCE CORNER

This information reflects General Account through December 31, 2025.

YTD Actual Giving	YTD Budgeted Giving
\$260,669	\$231,000

THANK YOU for a fabulous December! Giving was up significantly. We asked for your help and prayed to God, and God answered through you. Despite having a number of unexpected expenses in 2025, we were able to finish with a positive budget and strong balance – thanks to all of you!

We hope you will continue your generosity through 2026 as we are budgeting for another strong year. We appreciate our congregation and the many ways you give – through time, prayers and funds.

January Key Finance Meeting Takeaways

- General Account balance was up significantly due to a very strong December.
- An updated Memorial Policy was reviewed and approved. This will be shared with Administrative Council, and the approved version will be shared with the congregation in the Newsletter.
- The Payment Request Process was reviewed and approved. This will be presented to Administrative Council, and the approved payment process will be shared with the congregation in the Newsletter.
- The 2026 budget was discussed. With updated expenses and income expectations, our deficit is about \$10,000 - assuming Pastor share for the entire year. With current strong bank balances, this budget was approved by Finance Committee and will be presented to Administrative Council.



Our church is our second home - we all want it to have the care and upkeep it should. As we have had several unexpected expenses this year, we thought we would ask for your help. The Home Sweet Home Campaign will be for specific needs or items. The first item we would like help with is the HVAC for the basement. This is the 3rd HVAC (for different areas) we have purchased in 18 months! Our goal is \$10,600. We have received \$1853 putting us at 17% of goal. Thank you for your support!



Memorial Policy

2025

- A memorial is a contribution one makes in memory of a person who has died. To give in another's memory is to express the respect and love that continues beyond death. Carlisle United Methodist Church encourages memorial giving as a part of one's Christian Stewardship. The Memorial Committee seeks to assist persons in giving memorials by providing information and suggestions.
- All Memorials: After several months, a letter will be sent to the family specifying the memorial funds we have received. It will outline categories of use for the family to select from.
- Memorial donations - total is under \$500 and family did not respond to letter or specify a request: we will not reach out to family but will find an appropriate way to honor them.
- Memorial donations - total is \$500 or more and family did not respond to letter or specify a request - church will reach out to ask what area they would like funds directed toward (broad areas).
- If memorial funds have not found a use in the specified requested area within two years, the family will be notified one last time that the funds will be combined with other funds and used in a way to honor the individual.
- Memorial funds will not be used for day-to-day expenses, unless specifically requested by the family.
- If memorial is given through the estate and is (substantial), we will use it as specified or set up an account to follow their wishes, if at all possible.

Finance Committee Approval Requirements

The Finance Committee creates a budget each year which is approved by the Administrative Council. A copy of that budget is available from the Finance Chair or the Treasurer if there is a question on what has been budgeted. In 2023, the Administrative Council adopted the following procedure related to how different items must be approved for payment by the Treasurer.

If an item was not budgeted, it needs to be sent to Finance Committee for approval. If it is budgeted and below \$500, it does not need pre-approval. If it is over \$500, it does need pre-authorization of Finance Committee. If these items come in for approval when there is not a Finance Committee meeting in the near future, an email message will be sent for approval.
If an item is needed for approval, contact FinanceChair@carlisleiaumc.org and copy Treasurer@carlisleiaumc.org with questions or requests.

Note: this approval process does not apply to Kids Hope USA or the ASP youth mission program. Those programs have separate bank accounts.

Charges at Fareway or Sampson Harward (Carlisle True Value)

The church does have accounts at both Fareway and the hardware store for convenience.

Everyone needs to ensure they are following the process so that we can continue to offer this flexibility.

Church members MUST sign the receipt at the place of business in a fashion that the Treasurer can read who charged the item. Church members MUST submit the receipt with a Payment Request Form for General Account charges to the Office Secretary as soon as possible. This is to ensure that the appropriate budget category is charged.

Payment Request Forms for General Account, KHUSA, ASP, Building Addition, Memorial
All payment requests (whether budgeted or not budgeted) must be accompanied by a Payment Request Form signed by either the chair of the appropriate committee, a program administrator or the Church Secretary (if the Secretary ordered the products). Forms are available in the church office or via email from Office@carlisleiaumc.org. Do not email forms directly to Treasurer@carlisleiaumc.org.

Form Submission Process

Forms must indicate the bank account that the payment should come from as well as the accounting code (codes are listed on the form for the General Fund) or a description for the program accounts. Forms will be returned if they do not have the code. If you are unsure of a code, email Treasurer@carlisleiaumc.org for clarification.

All forms must be completed and submitted along with receipts to the Church Secretary either in hardcopy to the office or via Office@carlisleiaumc.org. Please allow up to two weeks for a payment to be made, as the Treasurer generally writes checks two times per month. If a church member paid with their own funds and a check is issued to them, payment will be placed in the Treasurer box in the entry way rather than mailed.


Spring Break!



We are so blessed and thankful for everyone who has made CUMC Kids Hope USA a success!








